## 549-HOPE NEWS

In the first six months of 2021, through approximately **1,800 calls,** our HOPE Coordinators, along with our church partners, were able to **help 306 different people** resulting in 50 diversions from homelessness, 62 preventions from becoming homeless, and 194 basic **needs** such as food and supplies met.

Total Church Resource used = **\$15,584** 

Total Community Resource used = **\$9,220** 

Total Resources Saved (through mediation and help with self-resolution) = **\$54,070** 

549-Hope Coordinator Rose DeRoche, BSW was recognized for being a **Top 10 HEMIS Coordinator**, qualifying her to help train others in using this central intake system that is used to identify needs and resources available.



Rose at 549-HOPE continues to be a total rock star in MCES. She's assessing a large majority of our inflow every week, which means she's contributing in BIG ways to ensuring folks are prioritized for our housing resources. We see you over there being an assessment master. Three cheers for Rose - the real MCES MVP!

My name is Desirae. I am a 29-year-old woman from Helena MT and I just completed 18 months at the Grace House. I came into this program a ward of the state, shattered in million little pieces, and stuck in the Bondage of MANY addictions for 17 years of my life. The grace house provided an opportunity and a safe space to shut out the world and cultivate a relationship with Jesus Christ which has ultimately transformed every area of my life. In the last 18 months I've gotten to know Jesus Christ on a personal level, his heart, his character, his nature, and in doing so, better understand my identity in Him. As I continued to heal and grow and mature, He gave me strength to not only boldly face my giants, but to behead them! He began to heal and restore my heart and make it whole again. He placed an army of believers around me to speak truth into my life and come alongside me, bear my burdens with me, and, most importantly, love me. The staff have helped me deal with the root causes of my addiction and better understand it. They have taught me how to be responsible and get back on my feet as I move into this next chapter of my life, and they are all family to me. My fearless leader DeNae Hammonds has set a wonderful example of what REAL recovery looks like. Nine months into my program, God restored my precious sons back to me who I had lost in my addiction for 3 1/2 years. And, I was granted full custody of them! God has been so faithful to me and is restoring everything the enemy tried to take from me. The Grace House also hired me to work for them at the Hope Thrift Boutique and here at the center as a staff member which really laid a wonderful foundation for work training. I am incredibly blessed and grateful that I was placed here with these God-fearing people to be a part of my journey as the Lord shapes me into the woman of character and integrity He's always intended me to be. Now I get the honor and privilege to pass that on to my sons! I am redeemed, I am set free, and I AM a new creation in Christ Jesus.



From Kim:

Before coming to the Grace House over 18 months ago, I believed my life was over. I had lost my relationships with my children, family and friends, and in my diseased mind, had lost my relationship with God. I was no longer a registered nurse and was unemployable for even the smallest of jobs. I was facing being evicted from my home, and through all of that was seeking more and more alcohol to relieve my pain. The alcohol stopped working, and I had decided death would be better than what I was going through. It was in that deep, dark place that I realized that Jesus was there with me; He brought me out of there and led me to recovery at the Grace House.

These last 18 months have not been easy. Physical sobriety was the first step, but not the most difficult. For me, the most difficult part was changing everything I thought about myself, and in some ways what I thought about God. The curriculum in the program was challenging and exactly what I needed to learn about myself, addiction, and why I continued to relapse over and over again. The emphasis on finding my identity in Christ through the classes, Bible studies, morning worship and Bible reading, and the other residents and staff supporting me, was crucial in my recovery, as was spending personal time in prayer and getting closer to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Through the prayers of so many, I successfully completed the 18-month program! Those prayers, and a lot of hard work, allowed me to obtain my RN license in Montana and I am now working as a hospice nurse in Missoula. I am so thankful and grateful for the love and prayers from all who support the Grace House and Hope Rescue Mission-I truly believe I "am fearfully and wonderfully made"! Grace does not depend on what we have done for God but rather what God has done for us.
