

NEEDS MET BY 549-HOPE

Utilizing church resources and existing community resources, HOPE Coordinators met \$124,567 in needs in Western Montana.

Nick and Karen were experiencing homelessness for a year. They finally came up on a waiting list and were able to secure a place to call home!

Since Nick and Karen did not have any furniture, 549-HOPE helped to coordinate needs with River of Life Church and was able to provide necessary furnishings through River of Life's Hands of Hope ministry.

They are now enjoying housing and are very thankful for all the assistance received by 549-HOPE in helping them to apply for what they needed to receive a housing unit

549-HOPE is a centralized call center for benevolence needs and social services. We partner with more than 15 local churches to help those in need. From rental and utility assistance, to helping to find a house to call home, HOPE Coordinators work with individuals to provide HOPE, assistance, and tranformational development.

Grace House Mission

Challenges at the Grace House this year included a common theme across the country - staffing shortages. In addition to QUANTITY challenges, the Grace House was challenged with retaining QUALITY staff members.

Low wages, staff burnout, and difficult ministry work all contributed to staffing concerns. With fewer faithful workers, the Grace House had to limit the number of women entering the program this past year.

2021 proved to be another record year for Hope Thrift Boutique! The Boutique has been blessed with an abundance of donations of clothing, home goods, and furniture.

HTB received more clothes than they could process and sell, so they shifted to hold more "Dollar Days" sales throughout the year to move the excess donations and make room for more.

2021 also presented a difficult year to find adequate staffing. The amazing volunteers have been the lifeblood of the boutique this last year!
