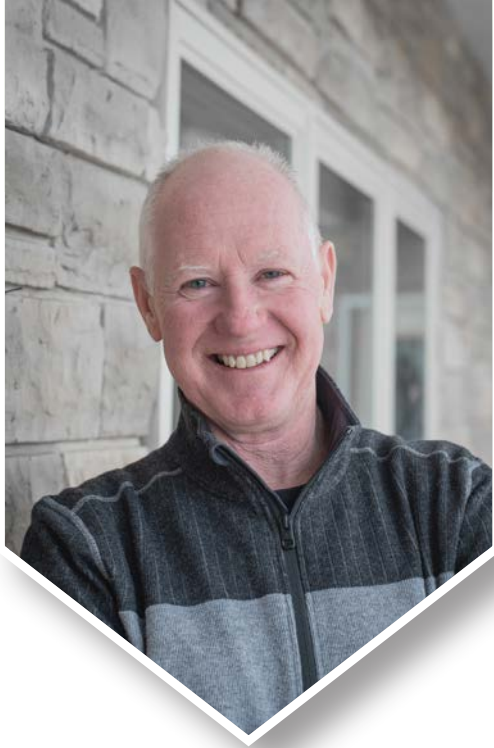

The Women's Center at Hope Rescue Mission is a place of healing from trauma, addiction, and brokenness. Our 18-month recovery program provides the time needed to not just change behavior (unlike a 30, 60, or 90-day treatment program), but to address the root causes for what is driving destructive behavior. It gives each participant an opportunity to discover their identity in Christ, restore relationships, begin to dream of a different life, and live in the freedom Jesus calls us to!

In 2022, the Women's Center provided 68 months of recovery to women at the Women's Center.

We continue to see growth at Hope Thrift Boutique - both in donations, sales, and space! With the addition of administrative offices offsite for Hope Rescue Mission, the Boutique was able to expand their sales floor and provide more storage for donations too. The boutique got a facelift over Christmas and the brighter space has been a hit!

Hope Thrift Boutique not only provides revenue for Hope Rescue Mission's programs and to reach those in need, but also serves as a life skills program for the women in the Women's Center program. Program participants learn various skills like customer service, inventory, budgeting, and design as well as mentorship from HTB leadership and the importance of interpersonal relationships.

HTB was able to provide over \$18,000 in benevolence in 2022 to meet the needs of the most vulnerable in our community with clothes and other necessities.

## DROP-IN CENTER/ 549-HOPE

With God's provision, guidance, and grace, we welcomed the addition of the Community Drop-In Center to Hope Rescue Mission, a place for receiving various social services such as help finding a home/apartment, help applying for or searching for employment, Bible studies, recovery support and resources, and prayer - and all when it is convenient for the individual.

Both our 549-HOPE ministry and the Drop-in Center were providing much needed services to vulnerable community members. However, after operations co-existed for a few months, it was determined that merging the two programs into one would result in more efficiency and quicker response to client needs.

This merge turned out to be a success and the DIC continues to be a single-point of intake for benevolence needs and has expanded to provide more housing services to meet the growing need in Missoula, began hosting Bible studies, and will be adding other programs and life skills workshops throughout 2023.

# RECYCLING/BALING PROGRAM

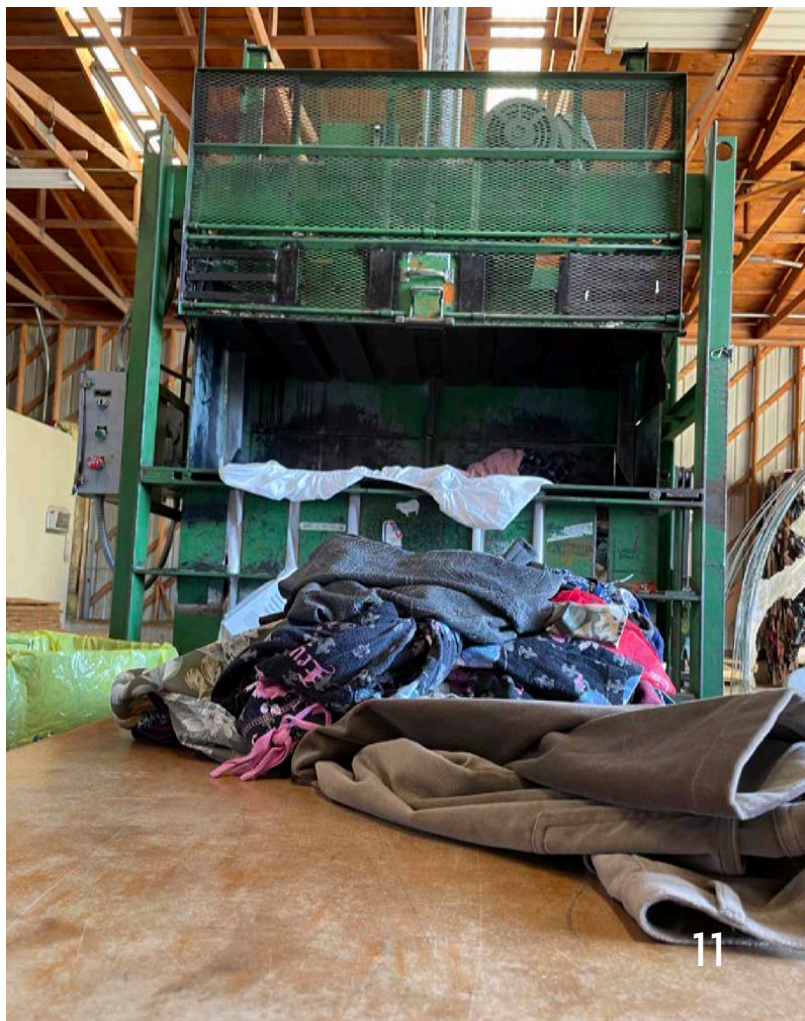
The baling operation at Hope Rescue Mission takes clothes, books, shoes, and other textiles in non-resaleable condition and compresses them into 1,000 lb. bales at our warehouse in Missoula. This keeps those items out of the landfill, promotes environmental awareness, and provides another opportunity for vocational training for TSOS participants and women at the Women's Center.
